Curriculum

- Topic -this term is all about jobs. We will be looking at different jobs in the world and the kind of skills and qualities needed for each one.
- Science We will be learning about Materials.
 We will be identifying the different everyday materials and we will be experimenting with each one.

Maths

In maths this half term we are covering
