Punctuality

It is really important to get to school on time. We open our doors at 8.45 for soft start. In soft start we have different activities to support children's development. We close the doors at 9am. Anyone arriving after 9am will need to go to the main office.

The EYFS Curriculum

There are 7 areas of the EYFS curriculum. Our focus in Reception is on:

Prime Areas

- Communication and Language
- Personal, Social and Emotional Development
- Physical Development

We will also provide opportunities in the environment for children to investigate and explore the **Specific Areas**

- Literacy (writing/reading)
- Maths
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Arts and Design

Our indoor and outdoor continuous provision covers all of the 7 areas so that children can develop skills in each area.

Reading

There will be lots of reading opportunities in the Reception class. Children will read 1:1 as well as in groups.

We will begin teaching reading through Read Write Inc. phonics (RWI) from Monday 13th September. Children will learn a new sound each day, starting with the letters of the alphabet in order of the most common letters first (m a s d t ...)

The best support you can provide is to read daily with your child. Our homework will also link to RWI Phonics.

Maths

This half term, children will be developing their understanding of number through concrete and pictorial representations (objects and drawings to support counting). Children will be introduced to abstract methods (written numbers) when they are confident to build on their understanding of number.

We will be focusing on:

- Counting numbers to 10
- Representing numbers
- Ordering numbers
- Subitising to 5 (recognising the number of objects by looking at their arrangement/pattern)

Supporting children at home will help their understanding. For example, counting toys, putting cups out, counting steps on the way home, showing a number of fingers 'all at once' without counting etc.

Children will also develop their understanding of shape, space and measure through different areas in the classroom. For example, positional language through games and tidy up time and by sequencing their day in Reception.

Literacy


We will be learning class stories through Pie Corbett's Talk for Writing approach. This involves lots of role play and drama to create fantastic writing experiences!

Our 2 week cycle helps children to retain and use new vocabulary independently and in groups.

Children learn a story structure through story maps and begin 'innovating' new stories by changing elements of familiar stories.
