**Reading Logs**

Children in years 1 –6 are expected to read every day at home. They are expected to record the book and in year 1 a parent can comment on their reading. In years 2 –6 children should record a brief summary, 3 keys points, from what they have read. We ask that parents support us with ensuring reading logs are kept up to date ( a minimum of 3 times a week) and that they are brought to school every day. Where children struggle to complete reading logs at home they will be encouraged to complete them in school in reading sessions. Children in year 5 and 6 who do not complete their reading logs at home may be asked to complete it at school.
