What is the Sports Premium? The Department for Education (DfE) are spending over £450 million on improving physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. The funding will be allocated directly to primary school's to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all pupils.

Our school allocation Our school was expecting to be awarded **£18,030** for the academic year 2022-23.

Nursery and Reception weekly P.E. for 2 hours to develop gross motor skills and learning in P.E.	£5,000	% of Nursery children have achieved age related expectations in physical development. % of reception aged pupils have achieved age related expectations in physical development. Children behave well, follow instructions and feedback that they enjoy PE.
To run cross school competitions to increase active participation in competitions.	£3,000	The school has trained children in preparation for tournaments. The school has taken part in tournaments half termly. This has enabled children to compete competitively and build relationships with peers from other schools.
To work towards Silver / Gold Healthy Schools status.	£3,000	The Assistant Headteacher has worked alongside kitchen staff, mid day meals and the PE coaches to develop our healthy schools silver application. We will gather evidence and submit in Autumn 2023.
Provide free after school clubs for up to 20 children per half term to ensure access to sports after school clubs.	£2,000	20 children per half term have received free after school clubs including daily sports clubs.
To develop / maintain lunch time sports leaders to lead activities for their class / younger children. To ensure high quality equipment is provided to support this.	£1,810	Sports leaders have met with the Assistant Head and PE coach weekly to develop their skills in leading games and sport at lunchtime. They have trained children to play football, king ball and skipping games.
To run Personal Best sports competitions throughout the year to ensure high quality fitness and personal target setting.	£1,000	PE leads have encouraged children to track their development and beat personal best scores. This has developed children's confidence and reliance and they have been able to articulate their improvements in skills, stamina and health.
To provide a sports coach to lead lunch time provision to ensure that high quality activities are promoted and developed.	£3,000	The school has timetabled 2 PE coaches to support lunch times. They have modelled games, refereed and supported staff to enhance their skills in modelling and monitoring games.
