Music

We follow the music programme Charanga and this half term the children will be learning new songs such as Three Little Birds.



Art and Design and DT

During Art lessons this term, the children will explore street art. They will learn about the work of artists such as Banksy and use new techniques to create their own street art inspired works.

Gainsborough Keeps Campaign

Our class campaign this term links to Article 24 You have the right to the best health care possible, safe water to drink, nutritious food, a clean and safe environment, and information to help you stay well.

During their campaign topic, the children will identify why biking to school is best in relation transport and it's link to air pollution. They will monitor and evaluate cycling to school and create a graph to show the data they have collected. Year 3 will share their analysis with their school community and promote and run a Bikers Breakfast event to persuade more children to bike to school in order to minimise our contribution to air pollution.

Writing



Our writing units this half term include, autobiographical writing, narrative writing, recount writing and persuasive writing. They will enjoy creating an imaginary world and writing a persuasive letter to encourage more children to bike to school as part of their Campaign project.

The children will work on their sentence structure, using capital letters for the names of people and places as well as ensuring their handwriting is joined and sentences end with a full stop. Throughout the term we will practise weekly spellings. Please ensure your child practises at home as these help with their fluency during independent writing..

Reading

Please ensure that you read weekly with your child and that they record a short summary of the story in their reading log. The children have access to Reading Plus and their log in details can be found at the back of their homework books.

Maths



Don't forget to log in to Mathletics and Times Tables Rock Stars. Your log in details can be found at the back of your homework book.

Our Maths focus this term will begin with place value before moving on to and addition and subtraction. The children will work on numbers to 100 before working with numbers to 1000 in completing addition and subtraction sums. To do this, they will understand the value of each digit in a number so that they are confident in comparing and ordering numbers.

At home, the children should begin learning their 3, 4 and 6 times tables.

ICT

In computing we will be looking at IT all around us, learning about computing systems and networks. We will also compare digital and non- digital devices.

History & Geography

Our Geography Topic this term is our local area. During the topic, the children will learn about Hackney including Key landmarks and local parks. They will enjoy a trip to Olympic Park where they will put their mapping skills to the test by identifying and recording landmarks. The children will learn about post WW2 Hackney and the Windrush and learn about the people who make our diverse community. At home, please discuss our diverse community and why different communities have migrated to Hackney.

Science

Our Science topic this term is animals including humans. The children will Develop their knowledge and understanding in nutrition, muscles, bones and joints They will further their knowledge of how to live a balanced and healthy lifestyle. The children will describe and compare the structure of a variety of common animals (fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals, including pets). They will compare carnivores, herbivores and omnivores
