Children will be given two books to take home, one which matches their phonics level and a book to read for pleasure.


The best support you can provide is to read daily with your child. Our homework will also link to RWI Phonics.

Key workers

Your child will be assigned a key worker. The key worker approach is an effective way of enabling children to develop a strong relationship with a significant adult in the setting. It also enables each child to feel secure and cared for, helping them to become familiar with the Reception environment and develop confidence and a feeling of security within it.
