### Reading


We will continue reading through Read Write Inc. phonics (RWI). Children will learn a new sound each day. Some children will learn to read simple sentences.

Please support your child to develop their reading skills by listening to them read everyday.



### Writing

Our core texts for this term are:





We will have mark making opportunities in different areas of the provision.

We will be writing character descriptions, making lists, instructions and retelling story on a story map

We will be using our phonic knowledge to write the sounds we can hear in words.

We will be writing sentences using finger spaces and full stops.

### Maths

This half term, the children will continue to develop their subitising and counting skills and explore the composition of numbers within and beyond 10. They will begin to identify when two sets are equal or unequal and connect two equal groups to doubles. They will begin to connect quantities to numerals

Children will:

- identify equal and unequal groups when comparing numbers.
- understand that two equal groups can be called a 'double' and connect this to finger patterns
- sort odd and even numbers according to their 'shape'
- join in with verbal counts beyond 20, hearing the repeated pattern within the counting numbers
