Our school allocation

Our school was expecting to be awarded £18 030 for the academic year 2024-25. We in fact received £17,573.

Nursery and Reception weekly P.E. for 2 hours to develop gross motor skills and learning in P.E.	£5,220	Children achieving PD is higher than previous years. The PD has fed in to the improved gross motor skills of the pupils and high levels of enjoyment and engagement. Coaches report the standard of PE the Nursery classes operate at is very high due to consistent provision weekly.
To run cross school competitions to increase active participation in competitions.	£3,000	The children have taken part in NFL, regular football, netball and basketball competitions. We have supported cycling clubs led by British Cycling and support a group of girls to access a girls football team. This has increased engagement and motivation at school and built networks for pupils outside school.
To work towards Silver / Gold Healthy Schools status.	£3,000	We have maintained the silver healthy schools application.
Provide free after school clubs for up to 10 children per half term to ensure access to sports after school clubs.	£2,000	Children attend free after school clubs at parent request. This year we have allocated 10 per half term for various reasons including: supporting parent mental health, rewards for improved attendance, to support families getting back into work and to safeguard children.
To develop / maintain lunch time sports ambassadors to lead activities for their class / younger children. To ensure high quality equipment is provided to support this.	£1,810	Coaches and senior leaders have managed pupils to support younger children in the playground, sports days and in clubs. This has been cross age relationships and improved engagement in games and sports for the younger children.
To provide a sports coach to lead lunch time provision to ensure that high quality activities are promoted and developed.	£3,000	Sports coaches support lunchtime games daily. This enables children to play sport throughout lunchtime. They are also able to train TA's and resources games to improve the provision in all areas of the playground.
