Reading


Writing

Our core texts for this term are:

Hello Friend So much! Lulu gets a cat







Book packs

We will be giving out reading book packs to children and family to read at home. This includes activities relevant to the story that supports children's writing and communication skills. Each book pack will be given out **every Friday** and should be returned on the following **Tuesday**.

We will have mark making opportunities in different areas of the provision. We will explore using different tools to make marks and begin to give meaning to them.


Our mark making opportunities will focus on making simple marks such as circles, straight and wavy lines. We will do this using a variety of tools i.e. pens, crayons, pencils and chalk.



Maths

In Nursery, the children will have opportunities to explore mathematical concepts in all areas of the provision.

We will be focusing on developing fast recognition of up to 3 objects (subitising) then 5 objects. We will also learn about what is the same and different about collection of objects.



Forest School

Forest School is a fantastic opportunity to learn outdoors. Children will need to come to school in suitable clothing as we learn the skills needed to be safe and successful at Forest School.

Forest School will take place from week beginning: 15th September.

Children will need wellington boots and puddle suits, our sessions will be on every **Wednesday morning**.



Tapestry

We will be using Tapestry, an online journal to document what your child's learning in class.

In order to view your child's journal you will be invited via a school letter. You will need to download the family app to your phone (giving you access to your child's learning journal) and choose to be notified when new content is added. If your child has attended our 2 year old provision, you will already have access to Tapestry.



Family Fridays

We would like to invite you into our class to do activities with your child from 8:45-9:30am every other Friday.

Our Family Friday dates for Swans are:

Friday 26th September- Swans Family Friday: Come along and decorate a photo frame with us.

Friday 10th October- Swans Family Friday: come along and make some 'people who help us puppets,' i.e. police officers, fire fighters, doctors.

Friday 24th October - Swans Family Friday: come and make some animal themed pancakes with us.



Junk modelling and loose parts

We use a lot of natural resources in our play to provoke imagination and we would appreciate your help with recycling items for our junk modeling sessions, such as: water bottles, cardboard boxes, or any loose part items such as lids, corks, pinecones, pebbles and shells.
