# Reading Writing

This half term we will be reading the 'Mungo' series by Timothy Knapman as our class reader and in our reading lessons. We will practise our summarising skills by identifying the main events from what we have read and completing summaries in our reading logs. It is a book full of adventure and science-fiction that keeps the children on their toes!

Our reading lessons will focus on a range of reading skills including:

- Finding information in the text
- Understanding new vocabulary in context and considering why an author uses these words
- Using clues from the text to work out the feelings of characters
- Making predictions about what will happen next

Our writing units this half term will be based around our topic of 'Different places, similar lives' and the book 'Gregory Cool.' Using this text, the children will write personal letters and descriptive retells. The children will compare and contrast the UK with Trinidad and Tobago to add detail to their written work. During this unit, the pupils will focus on conjunctions, expanded noun phrases and commas in a list. For example:

Gregory ran, skipped and cartwheeled on the warm, sandy shore because he was so excited!

#### Maths Science


In Maths this half term, we will be covering:

**Multiplication and division** - making and sharing groups in the 3,4 and 8 times tables. We will use our knowledge of grouping to understand multiplication facts.

**Further multiplication and division-** expanding knowledge of grouping by multiplying and dividing 2-digit numbers with renaming.

**length** - using centimetre, metres and millimetres to measure, compare and order lengths.

Our science topic this half term will be 'nutrition and diet.' We will explore the different food groups and discuss why each of them are important in a balanced diet. We will explore and compare different animal diets and also diet chives (e.g, veganism).

We will develop our scientific skills by hypothesizing what would happen if an animal didn't get the right nutrition and drawing out conclusions.

### **History and Geography**

Campaign

In Geography, we will be learning about different places, similar lives. We will explore and make comparisons to life in the UK vs life in Trinidad and Tobago. The children will be focusing on the human and physical geography in both Trinidad and Hackney, and discuss how they are similar and different. In addition, we will look at how different countries (Trinidad) have different cultures and



Our class campaign this term is linked to 'Keep Green.' We will be learning about sustainability and composting at Gainsborough and the positive effects of it on the planet. We will present our ideas about composting to the school.



ICT	Creating media We will develop our understanding of how pictures can 'move', by studying different animations, making our own flip-book stories and then using storyboard and ipas to make a moving picture film.
PSHE	Celebrating difference During this topic, the children will think about and discuss their ideas on family. They will explore how families differ from person to person. Then, they will be looking at anti-bullying, and learning how we can embrace differences.
RE	Christianity Our focus religion this half term is Christianity. Our key question is 'Has Christmas lost its true meaning? Has Christmas lost its true meaning?'. We will learn about Christian beliefs about Christmas and its importance.
PE	PE lessons this half term will focus on Handball.  Class PE Day: <b>Friday</b>
Music	Christmas songs The children will be exploring their christmas songs for their christmas concert in their music lessons.
Art	Op Art This half term in art, the children will learn about Op Art and flags and will use this to create a piece linked to their learning on different places, similar lives.
DT and Cooking	Cakes This half term in cooking, we will be making cake! Year 3 will be making carrot cake. Textiles We will be making christmas decorations, practicing our threading and sewing skills.
