Our learning will be centred around
This half term we will be learning about Winter. We will learn about the weather, how it feels in the winter and what clothes we might wear compared to the summer. **Know** what is similar and different when comparing sources from the past e.g. photos of **antarctica- ref to global warming)??**

As part of our **RE** topic we will be learning about celebrations and how different festivals are celebrated - we will focus on Lunar New Year, Persian new year and the festival of Holi.

Reading	Writing
<p>We will continue teaching reading through Read Write Inc. phonics (RWI). Children will learn a new sound each day, starting with the letters of the alphabet in order of the most common letters first (m a s d t ...). Once children are able to blend cvc words such as cat and mud they will be given two books to take home, one which matches their phonics level and one book to read for pleasure.</p> <p>The best support you can provide is to read daily with your child. Our homework will also link to RWI Phonics.</p> 	<p>In Reception we use lots of talk, discussions, role play and drama to create fantastic writing opportunities.</p> <p>We will have mark making opportunities in different areas of the provision. We will explore using different tools to make marks and begin to give meaning to them. This term the children will be writing simple sentences using finger spaces and full stops. We will learn how to describe a character and retell the story. We will have the opportunity to use our imagination and create our own story.</p> <p>Our core texts for this term are:</p> <div style="display: flex; justify-content: space-around;">   </div>
Maths	Forest School
<p>In Reception, children will have the opportunity to use their mathematical thinking in all areas of the provision. For example, children will be using measuring tapes in the construction area to measure their models.</p> <p>This term the children will learn counting to 10 forwards and backwards, ordering of numbers to, addition and comparing quantities.</p> 	<p>Forest School is a fantastic opportunity to learn outdoors. Children will need to come to school in suitable clothing as we learn the skills needed to be safe and successful at Forest School.</p> <p>Forest School will continue to take place from week beginning: 13/01/26 (weather permitting)</p> <p>Children will need wellington boots and puddle suits, our sessions will be every Tuesdays 10-11:45.</p>
