Our learning this half term is based around the topics; **Spring** and **Farm animals**.

This half term we will explore how to milk cows and shear sheep. The children will learn about the different vehicles that we see on farms such as combine harvesters and tractors.

In the last two weeks of this term we will focus on Spring time and the changes that take place in this season. We will look at the animals that are born during this season.

As part of our **RE** sessions we will focus on Easter and talk about what Easter represents for some people and how different people across the world celebrate their own traditions.

27th February 8:45-9:30 and 12:45-1:30 - come along and make your own farm animal mask.


13th March 8:45 - 9:30 and 12:45-1:30 come and make mothers day cards with us.



Please ensure that your child comes to school wearing their PE kit on **Mondays**

Book packs


We will be giving out reading book packs to children and families to read at home. This includes activities relevant to the story that supports children's writing and communication skills. Each book pack will be given out **every Friday** and should be returned on the following **Tuesday**.

Writing

We will have mark making opportunities in different areas of the provision. We will explore using different tools to make marks and begin to give meaning to them.

Our mark making opportunities will continue to focus on making discernible, purposeful and intentional marks such as writing letters for our names, and drawing familiar people and places. We will do this using a variety of tools i.e. pens, crayons, pencils and chalk.
